## **ATHLETIC FACILITIES**

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Andover's facilities for 30 sports include the new Pan Athletic Center (with 13-lane swimming pool, full water polo course, and diving section; 2 dance studios; and a dedicated wrestling space); the Snyder Center (with 200-meter, 4-lane indoor track; 12 international squash courts; all-weather practice for basketball and tennis; and multipurpose areas for yoga and life fitness programs); 2 hockey rinks; 2 basketball courts; fitness center; outdoor track; 18 playing fields (including artificial turf in Phelps Stadium); 18 tennis courts; paddle tennis court; nearby crew boathouse; and 4 fully staffed athletic training rooms.

## **SUMMER SESSION ([www.andover.edu/summer](http://www.andover.edu/summer))**

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A set of intensive academic enrichment programs, Andover Summer includes on-campus and online programs designed to complement the regular academic year offerings of Phillips Academy for over 900 students annually. Summer Session, the flagship program for rising 7th- through 12th-graders, offers more than 75 courses to boarding and day students through its Upper School, 9th-Grade Academy, and Lower School Institute. eSummer, a fully virtual program, offers more than 20 courses anchored in a personalized, mastery-based philosophy. Both on-campus and virtual programs offer specialized courses for English Language Learners. The newest offering, Andover Advantage, complements these programs by providing local students (those within commuting distance) with a two-week transitional academic experience to help fill summer skill gaps and ease back into the academic year.

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**Andover Bread Loaf**—Based in Lawrence, Mass., ABL has international reach. Summer and year-round programs empower students, teachers, schools, and communities by igniting a passion for learning through written self-expression and the arts. PA students in the Community Engagement program assist as tutors. Est. 1987.

**Institute for Recruitment of Teachers**—The IRT offers an intensive four-week summer program plus year-round mentoring that prepares rising college seniors and recent graduates from diverse communities for graduate school—and ultimately for careers in academic administration. Approximately 100 students annually. Est. 1990.

**Mathematics & Science for Minority Students**—(MS)<sup>2</sup> is a rigorous three-summer math and science scholarship program held on the Phillips Academy campus that prepares under-resourced African American, Hispanic/Latinx, and Native American public high school students for college and STEM careers. Est. 1977.

**PALS Program**—A multiyear program for Lawrence middle school students, PALS offers enrichment in math and language arts, support for the secondary school application process, and exposure to the skills needed for a smooth transition to high school and beyond. Intensive summer programming takes place on the PA campus and academic year sessions run at students' home schools. Tutors from Phillips Academy serve as teachers and mentors throughout the year.
